Introduction

This report presents the analysis of 6,112 visitor comment entries recorded on 16 visitor books throughout the run of *Mandela: The Official Exhibition* in London at 26 Leake Street Gallery from 8 February 2019 to 2 June 2019. The report intends to provide the exhibition organisers with insights into the reception of the exhibition during this World Premiere in London and, as such, better understand through the lens of the visitor books how visitors have reacted to the exhibition, whether they have connected emotionally with Nelson Mandela and what have been their overall takeaways. This, we hope, could form the basis for future fruitful multi-country analysis and comparisons as the exhibition is embarking on its World tour.

The ambition is therefore to outline patterns and key themes from visitor reactions that could subsequently be compared country to country; to explore whether there are some universal reactions or ways of engagement; and to examine whether responses reflect both the vision championed by The Elders ("a world where people live in peace, conscious of their common humanity and their shared responsibilities for each other, for the planet and for future generations") and the intention of the organisers to propagate the Mandela legacy and to get people excited about his work and, in turn, inspire them to get out into the World to continue it.

To this end, the first step of our work consisted in reviewing the press kit provided and to conduct targeted interviews to better understand the intention and expectations of the organisers. We conducted a preliminary meeting with Lizzy Moriarty (UK Operations Manager) and then phone interviews with Eric Eislund (Producer and General Manager), Caroline Kamana (Education and Communities Manager) and Steven Swaby (Lead Content Developer). This was followed by a comprehensive digitisation and transcription of the handwritten books to enable a standardised and systematic analysis exploring in particular demographic keys (What can the books tell us about who the visitors are? language, reason for visiting, ways of visiting – alone vs. with someone, etc.), the nature of their reactions (emotional, call for actions, etc) and the emerging themes. Finally, we reviewed the words most commonly used and provided a visual representation of the most repeated words alongside a selection of quotes & drawings summarising visually the reactions of visitors.


It is important to note that although we conducted a comprehensive and thorough analysis of the visitor books, this report cannot be viewed as an overall evaluation or visitor survey. It nonetheless provides useful insights which we hope will demonstrate how effective the exhibition



narrative and experience has been, the impact it created and takeaways for those who have seen the exhibition.

Before presenting the key findings, it is good to evoke the context and content of the exhibition. *Mandela: The Official Exhibition* is a major new global touring exhibition taking visitors on a personal journey through the life of Nelson Mandela. The exhibition celebrates his life and legacy as an iconic freedom fighter and political leader. The 750m2 exhibition experience is organised through a series of immersive zones: The Early Years, The Struggle is My Life, Prison Years, Anti-Apartheid in Britain, Freedom?, Healing a Nation and A Moment with Mandela. It features previously unseen film, photos and display over 150 historical artefacts and personal effects, notably on loan from the Mandela family. The visitor books were located on tables at the end of 'A Moment with Mandela' section on the way to the exit. Pencils were provided to visitors.

Finally, it must be noted that the majority of the visitor comment entries were written in English (97%) and only 4% of the entries were drawings.

Key findings

<u>Preliminary note</u>: All cited quotes below have been kept anonymous and kept exactly as they were written with no proof reading or typo corrections.

A. DEMOGRAPHICS | What did we learn about the visitors who left a record?

As mentioned previously, this is not a thorough visitor survey and cannot therefore be seen as an objective account of the overall visitor demographics. However, the visitor quotes provide some clues about the visitors themselves and their reception of the exhibition.

• A proud African connection

First of all, as mentioned previously the majority of the visitors wrote in English. It must be noted nonetheless that among the non-English quotes there are a number of quotes in African languages (Swahili, Zulu, Xhosa, Sesotho, Afrikaans).

"Lala Ngoxolo Tata Madiba!!" (Book 1, p31, Q3)

"Very emotional and so worth viewing. Baie Dankie:)" (Book 1, p31, Q3)

"Viva ANC Viva. Amandla, ngawethu! Proudly South African" (Book 1, p26, Q2)

In addition to this, 2%¹ of the visitors decided to highlight their personal connection either to Mandela himself or to South Africa.

"An inspiring and emotional visit. I lived through some of this and remember hearing about Nelson as a child in the 80's but not fully understanding what a great man he was. Thank you." (Book 10, p57, Q5)

"Proudly South African" (Book 9, p144, Q2)

"As a South African this was truly an amazing experience. We still have a long way to go for world peace and freedom and equality of [sic] all" (Book 1, p8, Q2)

'It is amazing to see the life of a human that my grandpa worked for. Thank you! It is so interesting! (Book 1, p8, Q4)



2,5% of the quotes make reference to visiting with a family member. Some highlighted in particular how grateful they were to their loved ones for organising this outing on a special and meaningful family occasion such as a birthday, Mother's Day or an anniversary.

B. NATURE OF REACTIONS | How did the visitors receive and react to the exhibition?

• An emotional experience

42.5% of the visitor quotes demonstrate an emotional engagement from the visitors. This is illustrated by the use of exclamative punctuation [e.g.'!'], signs [e.g. ':)'] or clearly identified vocabulary [e.g. 'moving', 'tears'] which express the visitors' emotive responses to the exhibition.



"The best ever Mother's Day gift I could ask for. I had goose bumps moments [sic] during the exhibition. What sacrifice N.M. made to give the people hope and encouragement for a better today! May we all follow and aspire to make a little difference to the lives of those not so fortunate - Education is the key as he advised his son in his letter from the prison. Thank You to my two most adorable children to have given [sic] me this opportunity to be inspired. Long live the legacy." (Book 9, p34, Q2)



The exhibition seems not only to have triggered visitor emotions but also, in some cases, made connections at a deeper spiritual level. 2,1% of the visitor quotes make direct reference to religion.

"Praise God for His Mercy and His grace and using Nelson Mandela to suffer for freedom." (Book 9, p13, Q3)

"Thank you God for Nelson Mandela." (Book 9, \$36, Q4)



"Thank you for a remarkable experience. On the brink of tears most of the time, I was **reminded of** the miracle God performed through the hands and heart of Madiba and others in my beautiful homeland. God bless Africa." (Book 11, p19, Q2)

"This has been a very emotional journey. I'm quite overwhelmed by it all. He was definitely sent to us by God." (Book 10, p2, Q1)

An intimate connection

41.7% of the visitor quotes express praise and gratitude towards Nelson Mandela's life, for the example he set and the social and political progress he brought through his fight.

"Nelson Mandela revolutionised the world and greatly helped to make it the way it is today. He set an example for everybody to stand up for what they believe in and what is right and never give up, no matter how discouraged you are or how difficult it is. He has changed the world and is an inspirational role model." (Book 10, p39, Q2)

"Thank you Mandela for your spirit for your perseverence [sic] for your determination [sic] I see you [sic] I love you" (Book 9, p30, Q1)

"We salute you! Thank you for your service to our people" (Book 9, p43, Q1)

"One of the greatest leaders, one of the greatest humanitarians in human history. This exhibition benefits and honours the man. True inspiration." (Book 9, p43, Q3)

"A wonderful exhibition about a truly great and wonderful man. I wish we all learned the power of forgiveness." (Book 2, p82, Q1)

Moreover, 16,7% of the visitor quotes address Nelson Mandela directly. This, combined with the large emotional response, shows that the organisers of the exhibition really managed to create a strong intimate connection by conveying Mandela's life through a new lens. Some expressed their thanks to the Mandela family for sharing his story in such an emotional, yet effective way.



21,6% of the visitor quotes are clear calls to keep Nelson Mandela's legacy alive and carry on his fight for justice. This shows a clear empowering impact of the exhibition, which not only brings awareness about injustice but also stresses that it is in everyone's capacity to fight them. This sense of a living legacy is also stressed by some of visitor quotes making direct references to the values that Nelson Mandela stood for (freedom, equality, justice, respect, individual agency).

While the call for actions are very generic, a few draw parallels with a leadership vacuum in contemporary world politics. 2,9% of the quotes are indeed directly calling for new leaders inspired by Nelson Mandela.

Amazing man with fantastic vision who brought great hope to the world. Where is the next Nelson Mandela? (Book 1, p98, Q1)

D. EXHIBITION RECEPTION | How did the visitor experience the exhibition?

It is worth noting that the visitor quotes are overwhelmingly positive. Among the 0.8% of the visitor comments which are critical about the exhibition most of them are actually calling for improvement rather than expressing disapproval of the exhibition and its content. It seems like visitors are feeling ownership and, to some extent, responsibility for ensuring Nelson Mandela's legacy could be better shared with more people. Indeed, most of the comments are either highlighting parts of the history they feel have been overlooked or calling for an improvement of the interactivity of the display or a better venue to host what they see as a very positive exhibition experience.

On the content

'I'm pleased it wasn't shy of reflecting complexity + challenge. Loved the objects (his Letters!). Very effective presentation. Could have been harder on the UK govt [sic] and Thatcher. Very moving - on far more levels than I expected + all the better for it. The message is hard to take amid the awfulness of today. We need him." (Book 3, p45, Q3)

What is striking when analysing the visitor books is the strong sense of gratitude expressed not only vis-à-vis Nelson Mandela himself but also towards the exhibition and its organisers. 35.9% of the visitor comments are highlighting the powerful experience they had during their visit as well as the very effective way Mandela's story was brought to life through the exhibition display. Finally, the enthusiasm for this very special exhibition is also frequently expressed by visitors praising the exhibition as one of the best they ever attended.

The Word Cloud representation below provides an indication of the words most frequently used by the visitors across the visitor books (the more frequently used, the bigger the word).

This visual summary corroborates the key findings presented previously. The names 'Nelson' and 'Mandela' are among the most cited words in the visitor books. They very often correspond to direct addresses to Mandela. This illustrates, as mentioned previously, the close and intimate connection visitors have felt with Mandela as a result of the exhibition. People are also very frequently reference the 'exhibition' itself in their comments. They praise the exhibition and express a sense of gratitude to have been able to 'walk through Mandela's life' thanks to the exhibition ("An amazingly inspiring full exhibition. I walked and journeyed with one of my lifes [sic] hero's [sic]. Thank you soo [sic] soo [sic] much"—Book 10, p74, Q2). The sense of gratitude is also directed towards Mandela himself for his sacrifice, his leadership and the source of inspiration he provides. A significant number of words in the visitor books also refer to emotion—"moving", "amazing", "beautiful", "love"—illustrating the emotional response to the exhibition. "Always", "Forever", "Legacy" are also frequently used in the visitor comments. These words are often used to emphasize the importance of his legacy and a desire for it not to be forgotten ("such an






Conclusions

This analysis of the 6,112 visitor comment entries recorded on 16 visitor books throughout the run of *Mandela: The Official Exhibition* in London at 26 Leake Street Gallery from 8 February 2019 to 2 June 2019 has provided greater insight into the reception of the exhibition's World Premiere in London. It helped also to qualify the types of impact the exhibition has had on its visitors.

Overall, the large majority of the comments were extremely positive about the exhibition and the relevance of Mandela's legacy to today's complex and uncertain world. People's reactions were also engaged and emotional. The reactions captured in the visitor's books combine a sense of emotional connection to Mandela as well as a sense of call for action and engagement in the world. From that perspective, it seems that the exhibition has clearly delivered on its dual ambition: communicating the vision championed by The Elders ("a world where people live in peace, conscious of their common humanity and their shared responsibilities for each other, for the planet and for future generations") and propagating the Mandela legacy by exciting people about his work and, in turn, inspiring them to get out into the World to continue it.
